

## JA Our Families® Program Overview



JA Our Families introduces students to learning objectives for first-grade social studies, including families, neighborhoods, money, and needs and wants. Through hands-on classroom activities, students also explore the concept of entrepreneurship, specifically the ways in which businesses provide goods, services, and jobs for families. JA Our Families is volunteer-taught and kit-based, and includes five 30-minute sessions, with additional extended learning activities and optional digital assets offered throughout.

SESSION FOUR Jobs All Around the Neighborhood	Recognize that entrepreneurs create businesses, which provide jobs for families and make the place where they live better.	<ul> <li>Identify the jobs people do.</li> <li>Analyze their own skills to determine ways they can support family members.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Give clues to a classmate to help him or her guess a worker's job.</li> <li>Complete the Jobs I Can Do! page in their journals.</li> </ul>
SESSION FIVE A New Business	Think like entrepreneurs and help advertise a new business needed in the neighborhood.	Describe one of the entrepreneurial characteristics: Satisfy a Need or a Want.	Solve math problems to color in a picture of a new business in the neighborhood.
