The **JA Titan Challenge** puts students in charge of virtual companies in a competitive business simulation. Teams must make critical decisions involving pricing, production, marketing, research and development, and corporate social responsibility while balancing profitability and long-term business growth.

At Future Bound, students will compete for national honors, scholarships, awards, and recognition while gaining valuable real-world experience and networking opportunities with business leaders and mentors.
